# HELP THE CHILDREN 2016 – A HIGH-IMPACT PROJECT IN MALANG, EAST JAVA

Last week 20+ members, family and friends from the Rotary Club of Singapore were joined by 10+ from the Rotary Clubs of Kuching Central and Likas Bay, including President Clarence and Past District Governor Haji Andre Suharto from Kuching Central and Immediate Past District Governor Philip Chong from Likas Bay.

Together we met with the Rotary Club of Malang Central of District 3420, led by President Widyastuti Laksmi for the launch of the USD84,000 Help The Children 2016 Global Grant, which is a joint project of the Rotary Clubs of Malang Central, Marina City, Kuching Central and Singapore. Also attending from District 3420 were District Governor Ni Nyoman Nilawati from the Rotary Club of Bali Taman, and District Governor Elect Hermanto Angka from the Rotary

Club of Surabaja Darmo.

To this end, the Global Grant also contained a key livelihood training program for parents, and a professionally-facilitated two-day teacher training seminar, to enhance the lives of all beneficiaries.

The group also visited Bakti Lahur Orphanage, to see the progress of a separate Global Grant, aimed at providing physiotherapy equipment for orphanage residents. This Global Grant is still in progress, with some equipment yet to arrive and be installed, but it was clear that the equipment that has arrived is being put to very good use, and is very much needed and appreciated by the beneficiaries.

Such programs are the culmination of many months of preparation and hard work, coordinating with all of the various stakeholders. I have had the privilege of seeing the Global Grants go from draft to execution, and gratefully acknowledge the leadership and hard work of our PP Dr Shahul Hameed, in supporting the tireless efforts of the President and Members of the Rotary Club of Malang Central, assisted by the new Rotaract Club of Malang Kutaraja (chartered January 2016) as they worked with 25 different school administrations and the Mayor's office at Kota Batu. This is also an opportunity to acknowledge the wonderful support extended by the Kota Batu City Mayor Eddy Rumpoko and his wife, Dr Hj Dewanti Rumpoko M. Si. Dr Hj Dewanti was Guest of Honour and host at the project launch at the Kota Batu City Hall.

In addition to contributions received from Rotary Club of Singapore members and our Partner Clubs, Honorary Member Rotarian Mohan Vaswani and his wife Ibu Kawita Vaswani, have contributed greatly to making the Global Grants a success. In addition, they made sure that all visitors to Malang were very well looked after, throughout the visit from Surabaya airport, to Malang and Batu, and back, including hosting a special dinner on Saturday night at their beautiful home in Selecta.

Behind the scenes, Rotarian See Mee Lee was typically hard-working and proactive, making sure that all participants were in the right place at the right time; and many of the photographs you have seen from the visit were taken with the keen eye of Rotarian Andy Mankiewicz. And finally, we were greeted and farewelled in fine style by members of our Sister Club, the Rotary Club of Surabaya, who made sure we didn't miss our return flight, despite heavy traffic on the return trip from Malang.

All in all, these meaningful and sustainable projects, and the opportunities we have to share experiences among members of many different clubs, are an excellent example of what Rotarians can and do achieve — long may it continue! — GT



### **Last Week**

Speaker: Mr Nicholas Ng, Co-Founder, The Food Bank Singapore

**Topic:** "The Food Bank Singapore"

Rtn Joseph Chia was called upon by President Garry to introduce the Guest Speaker, Mr Nicholas Ng, is the Managing Director of FoodXervices Inc Pte Ltd in charge of logistics, operations and procurement. He works alongside his sister Nichol to oversee a team of 50 staff. Nicholas brings with him a wealth of experience in the food and beverage industry.

Mr Ng was invited to address the Club in his capacity as Co-founder of The Food Bank Singapore which he set up with his sister, Nichol, in January 2012 and received IPC status in May 2015.

Mr Ng started his presentation with the startling statistics that globally 1.3 billion tonnes of food was wasted annually, 4 times enough for the world's 868 million starving. He added that in Singapore 785,500 tonnes of food was wasted last year; equivalent to 108 full-load double-decker buses daily, more than enough to feed the 387,000 food insecure.

Mr Ng spoke of the Food Bank's vision to be the prevailing centralized coordinating organization for all food donations and to play a key role in the reduction of food wastage within the whole supply chain. He explained how food banking worked through acquiring donated food, much of which would otherwise be wasted, from farms,

manufacturers, distributors, retail stores, consumers, and other sources, and make it available to those in need through a network of 170 member beneficiaries. listed the types of foods collected - perishable and nonperishable, cooked and expired food.

Mr Ng highlighted how members' could participate in their various programmes such as depositing excess but edible at 39 Keppel Road Tanjong Pagar Distripark S089065. Alternatively, Mr Ng informed members to consolidate donated items and arrange for a pick up at email enquiries@foodbank.sg or adopt a Food Bank box for their corporate offices, as well as several other options. Mr Ng

added that monetary donations were also welcomed to fund and support their logistical overheads and that cash donations were tax deductible.

President Garry called upon PP Tapan Rao who warmly thanked Mr Ng for his insightful presentation.
